We are announcing the Inaugural Tucson Air Races and Air Show March 10-12, 2006, to be held at Ryan Airfield just southwest of Tucson, Arizona.

With the addition of that air race we embark on a new chapter in the history of air racing by developing a series sanctioning body appropriately named the "American Air Races" that will allow national sponsors to have a consistent branding message within our races. Other races will fall under this banner to be named in the near future.

This growth is a tremendous opportunity for air racing in Tunica, Tucson as well as Reno. But for the greater good we are embarking on this ambitious undertaking to grow the sport of air racing across the United States. Race classes are to be announced soon.

Now pilots and aircraft owners will have more national marketing channels directly with aviation fans, it will also provide a series of races that will attract national sponsors. Sponsors are very interested in

With this new series and multiple races, we have the product to compete for national and regional sponsors, though local sponsors will always be the bedrock for each of these events.

We have been approached by several cities in their quest for a signature event. We approached Tucson for several reasons.

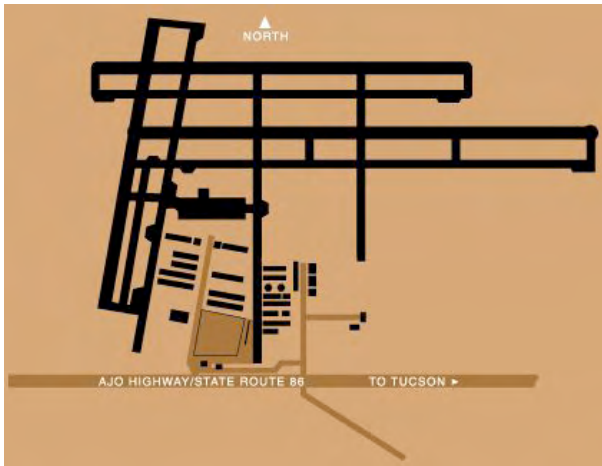
LOCATION, the great Southwest just a little over an hour from Phoenix about six hours from San Diego and eight hours from Los Angeles.
